



Dear Parents, Carers and Guardians,

Opening thoughts

Once again, we find ourselves in a changing world and seek to manage changing advice as we calm the anxieties and tensions that come with this new uncertainty. I hope that the latest Covid-19 response doesn't impact too greatly on our preparations for Christmas and the activities we have planned over the coming weeks.

Sadly, Covid-19 is very much high on everyone's agenda once again. So I am writing to you to outline what we can all do as a community to protect one another.

As you will be aware, currently children do not need to isolate if they have been a close contact to anyone who tests positive for Covid-19 unless they live in the same household. If someone in the same household tests positive then we will be asking you take your child for a PCR test, isolate until the results are in and if negative, they can return to school.

At present, we understand that the new variant has currently changed the isolation rules and could potentially cause a lot of disruption for our school and the children, families, and staff within it. Anyone who is identified as a close contact to someone who tests positive for Covid-19 Omicron variant will have to isolate for 10 days regardless of age or vaccination status.

In school, this would mean that we may have to close year group bubbles and move to remote learning if staffing was significantly impacted. This is obviously something that we want to avoid at any time, but particularly as we get so close to the Christmas holidays, and everyone looks forward to spending time with their families and loved ones. So, I ask once again for your support in some simple actions that will help to protect our community. The following actions will help all of us within our community:

Face Coverings

We ask that you wear a face covering when dropping off and collecting your children from school. If you are exempt then please wear a lanyard to indicate this or please speak to us in advance. We will also be asking all visitors to the school to wear face coverings and this is also true of staff who are using communal areas.

Social Distancing

Please do contact the school office, ideally by email admin@woodford.northants.sch.uk or phone 01832 733 221. If you do need to come to the office in person, please ensure that there is only one adult in the reception area at one time and you are wearing a face mask unless you are exempt

Symptoms

Be extra vigilant on monitoring your child for any symptoms of Covid-19 (cough, high temperature, loss of sense of smell or taste) and seek a PCR test if your child displays these symptoms. Please be considerate of the fact that we are also being extra vigilant and if we contact you to ask you to collect your child and get them a PCR test please remember that we are following government guidance. Anyone with symptoms, however mild, must isolate at home until the results of a PCR test are known.



Illness

We are aware from colleagues in other schools that they are noticing that children are often displaying other symptoms such as headache, sore throat or upset stomach. Although we can't enforce seeking a PCR test with these symptoms, you may wish to consider doing one as an extra layer of protection for our school community.

Lateral Flow Tests

The guidance for schools asks that all secondary age students and all school staff take part in lateral flow tests twice a week. The staff in school are taking part in these tests and it has enabled us to quickly identify Covid-19 cases. Test kits can be ordered from the NHS website. [click here to visit the NHS website.](#)

If your child needs to isolate please contact the school office and we will arrange for the class teachers to send you work for your child to complete if they are well enough.

Whilst we are forever hopeful that our current plans, and us working together, will enable the school to remain fully open, we wanted to be prepared in the event of class or year group closures.

In the event that we have to move to remote learning for class or year groups, we will share the expectations around this at that time.

Safeguarding, GDPR and Expectations

If we have to move to remote learning, all of the sessions will be recorded for safeguarding purposes. In keeping with GDPR, these are closed sessions and will be deleted after a short period of time.

We have very clear expectations for our live sessions and we will ask the following:

- Parents are asked to be present in the room with their child during the meetings but must be off screen and must not contribute or interrupt the live session.
- Parents support high expectations for behaviour and conduct during sessions, and we will be insisting on these in the same way that we do when we are in the classroom.
- Children should be actively listening and participating in sessions; they will be required to raise the virtual 'hand' to speak and should remain 'muted' unless they are asked to 'unmute'.
- Children should not be eating, drinking or playing with anything during these sessions
- Children should be dressed appropriately for learning – no pyjamas.

As a school, we will continue to share expectations and give praise to children that are meeting them, as we would do in the classroom.

Hopefully, we will not have to move to remote learning but if we do and you have any trouble please do not hesitate to email your child's class teacher and they will call you to offer advice and support.

Thank you for your continued support in protecting our school community.

- Please DO NOT come to the performance if you develop any symptoms of Covid (high temperature, new continuous cough or a change/loss of sense of taste/smell.)
- Please wear a face mask if you would like to.

Online Advent Calendar 2021

Canon Jane Whittington and Rachel Boxer from the Diocese of Guildford have shared a brand-new online Advent Calendar for schools, with a primary and a secondary version. The content behind the door's links to the theme 'Everyone is Welcome', and they have chosen Bible passages that demonstrate welcome and inclusion, using images and videos that reflect a diversity of ethnicities and cultures to illustrate these stories.
